	Advanced reading, writing, vocabulary and conversation. Study of poetry, short fiction, press, and memoir literature by Zeitlin, Bergelson, Gladshteyn, Sholem Aleichem and I. I. Singer. Selected advanced grammatical topics presented in conjunction with the study of texts. Conducted entirely in Yiddish. Prerequisite: GER 360H1/Y1 or permission of instructor
History	
HIS 345H1	History and Film
	This course is designed to further students' knowledge of films' relationship to the events they depict and their undeniable power as representational systems to render history effectively. This will necessarily entail both close examination of the formal systems film rely upon and an understanding of the distinction between fictional and non-fictional forms in film.

HIS 418H1 Women in Imperial Russia

Students explore the changing roles of women of various social classes in Imperial Russian history through an examination of their domestic and public lives. Themes include: the importance of 18th century female rule, the women question, reform of family and property law, female

radicalism and impact of industrialization.

JUP 450H1 Advanced Topics in Cognitive Science

An advanced seminar in cognitive science; topics include object perception, intention, & planning, problem-solving & creativity, distributed

cognition, emotions, cognitive poetics.

Near & Middle Eastern Civilizations

NMC 352Y1 Faith and Doubt in Modern Hebrew Poetry

An exploration of the relationship of Modern Hebrew poetry to the Jewish religious tradition.

NMC 355Y1 The Hebrew Bible in Translation

A survey of the various themes, ideas, and features of the Hebrew Bible and the world that gave rise to it.

Political Science

POL 401H1 Dynamics of the Global Trade System

This course addresses the global trading system by examining the political, economic, legal and institutional forces that shape today's

contemporary international system. Prerequisite: Minimum 14 FCEs

Recommended preparation: Some international economics and Canadian political economy.

POL 421H1 Maimonides and His Modern Interpreters

The course offers an introduction to the seminal work of Jewish philosophy, 'The Guide of the Perplexed' by Moses Maimonides.

Prerequisite: Minimum 14 FCEs

Psychology

PSY 335H1 Environmental Psychology

An examination of the interrelationship of humans and their natural and built environments. Topics include: the self in relation to nature; environmental quality and psychological well-being; and the relationship between individuals' experience (i.e., cognition, emotions, and values),

motivations and action relating to environmental issues

Prerequisite: PSY 201H1, 220H1

PSY 336H1 Positive Psychology

A review of the field of positive psychology, which is the study of fulfilment and personal growth. The focus is on empirical research regarding the development of healthy, productive, and resilient individuals. Topics include: subjective well-being, optimism, flow experiences, self-control

and emotional intelligence, social support and empathy

Prerequisite: PSY 201H1, 230H1/240H1

Spanish

SPA 341H1 Modernist Movements in Spain

Literary and artistic movements in Spain from 1890 to 1940, with special attention to the convergence and mutual mediation of politics and art. Materials to be studied include novels, poetry, the urban movement, graphic art, literary journals and manifestos, and some early Hispanic

SPA 488H1 New Narrative Fiction of Central America
